## The Position/Solution Frame

Problem/solution frames introduce a problem and then identify one or more solutions to the problem.

*Problem:* A statement something that has happened or might happen that is problematic.

Solution: A description of one possible solution.

Solution: A statement of another possible solution.

Solution: A statement of another possible solution.

Solution: Identification of the solution with the greatest chance of success.

## **Frame Questions**

- 1. What is the problem?
- 2. What is a possible solution?
- 3. What is another possible solution?
- 4. Which solution has the best chance of succeeding?
